RON BONNEAU: HEAD ALPINE SKI COACH / OUTDOOR PROGRAM DIRECTOR

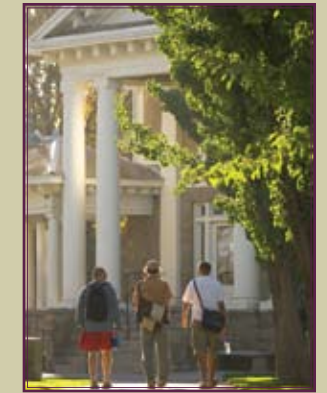


Ron Bonneau is in his 19th season as head coach for The College of Idaho alpine ski programs.

During his tenure at The C of I, the native of New Hampshire has seen the Coyote men's team qualify for the USCSA Championships on 12 occasions, with the women's team making appearances 15 times. His 2004 women's squad finished second in the nation in the slalom and fourth in the alpine combined. The Coyotes have seen much success in the 21st century, as both the men's and women's programs, under Bonneau's direction, have won seven consecutive Northwest Collegiate Ski Conference Championships, with the Lady 'Yotes taking home Northwest Regional Championships in 1999, 2003 and 2006. His women's teams have advanced to ten consecutive USCSA championships, finishing in the Top 10 on each occasion. He has coached five national champions, 53 All-Americans, and 82 Academic All-American Scholar-Athletes.

Prior to his time in the Gem State, Bonneau worked at ski resorts in Wachusett, Ma. and Haystack, Vt. Along with his duties for the ski programs, he is the director of The C of I's outdoor program. Bonneau and wife Michele live in Caldwell.
