Salmon River Clinic Internship

General Description

This primary and emergency care internship is for 2 undergraduate students at the Salmon River Clinic in Stanley, Idaho. Successful applicants must live on-site from early June through Labor Day weekend. These positions involve assisting resident staff 5-6 days/week as defined by clinic director in primary emergency care procedures **for 2 consecutive summers** (exceptions may be made for juniors). There will be opportunities to help on the ambulance and you will be expected to do some extra reading as directed by the clinic director. Each student receives a stipend and free lodging at the clinic. Internship credit may be earned with **BIO or HHP 397**. Students enrolled for this credit must keep a journal and do a case study write up. The successful applicants will need to supply proof of vaccination and TB test results. In addition, the students must agree to abide by Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996 regulations.

<u>Eligibility</u>

To apply for a SRC internship, applicants must have:

- A minimum GPA over all science courses of 3.2 (4.0 scale).
- Completed sophomore or junior year prior to the summer participation.
- Firm plans to pursue a degree in the field of medicine (MD, DO, or PA).
- Completed the following courses prior to starting the internship:
 - 1. Chemistry 141/142
 - 2. Biology 201, 202, 330 or 224-225
- Additional course work recommended:
 - 1. Biology 374, 360
 - 2. Chemistry 301/302

Previous medical training/certifications, while not required, will be considered.

Selection Procedure

Selection is competitive, based on the criteria above, transcripts, letters of evaluation, and a brief essay. There may also be an interview if the committee feels they cannot decide on the application materials alone. The best-qualified students will be selected by a committee at The College of Idaho.

Application

Applicants must submit the following information:

- Completed application form and essay. (See below)
- Unofficial transcripts of all college course work
- Two letters of evaluation from faculty who know your work and can comment on your potential success in medicine, including character and level of maturity.
