With the support of the Wood River Presbytery, the

College was founded in 1891 by Dr. Rev. William Judson Boone, who served as its first president for 45 years. In 1893, it was incorporated under the laws of the State of Idaho and placed under the leadership of a Board of Trustees. The College changed its name in 1991 to Albertson College of Idaho in honor of alumni and long-time donors Kathryn and Joe Albertson–of Albertson's Inc., one of the country's largest supermarket chains. The College reverted back to its original name in 2007, in agreement with the Albertson Foundation. The College has been accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities since 1922.

FACILITIES AND RESOURCES

Our beautiful campus is situated on 50 acres and sits adjacent to the historic district of Caldwell. Facilities include 16 academic, athletic, student life and administrative buildings; 7 residence halls offering a mix of single, double, triple, quad, and suite-style housing; an apartment complex located on campus offering a more independent student living experience; and a small number of College-owned student houses adjacent to campus.

Our newest building, the Cruzen-Murray Library, was completed in early 2018 and was the gift from the estate of the late Deborah Cruzen-Murray and her husband, Glenn Richard Murray, Jr. The library offers state-of-the-art study areas, classrooms, presentation space and collaboration space. Recent campus improvements include renovation of several historic residence halls, the addition of a new suite-style residential housing space, and improvements to the College's science building.

The College has more than 50 <u>student clubs and organizations</u>, including an active student government (Associated Students of The College of Idaho), a student newspaper, and intramural sports programs. The College also has one fraternity and two sororities.

The College provides outstanding performing arts events through its music and theatre programs, which present numerous concerts, plays, and other performances throughout the academic year. These performances feature not only College of Idaho students but also faculty.

Students can attend exhibitions at the Rosenthal Gallery of Art, which hosts exhibitions throughout the academic year, including shows by notable regional artists, College faculty and staff, and graduating art majors.

The College of Idaho has long been known for its excellence in the sciences. <u>The Orma J. Smith Museum of Natural</u> <u>History</u> is home to extensive insect, aquatic invertebrate, mollusk, and archaeological collections, which are used by students and national and international experts for a variety of research projects. The Museum also holds the Evans Gem and Mineral Collection. With more than 45,000 specimens, the Harold Tucker Herbarium is used extensively by students and botanists throughout the country, and the <u>Whittenberger Planetarium</u> presents a variety of public astronomy shows throughout the year.

The College of Idaho Outdoor Program offers exceptional outdoor recreational and educational activity opportunities for students. Guided activities include camping, fly fishing, kayaking and rafting, and rock climbing.

ATHLETICS

The College of Idaho is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). It primarily competes in the Cascade Collegiate Conference, although it is also a member of the Frontier Conference for Football and the Pacific Northwest Collegiate Lacrosse League

The College of Idaho is home to 19 varsity <u>athletic</u> teams competing at the NAIA level. Our student-athletes are winners, not just in sports, but in life.

More than half of students at The College of Idaho compete for one of our varsity teams. Our student-athletes have captured 17 individual national titles in women's track and field, women's cross country, and men's swimming, along with team national championships in men's and women's cross country, men's basketball, and baseball. Since 2011 alone, the College has brought home 24 NAIA national titles and has seen multiple student-athletes go on to play professionally in leagues around the world, including Major League Baseball.

In addition to winning on the field, our student-athletes dominate in the classroom. Each year, the College is among the national leaders in Academic All-Americans and NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

LOCATION

The College of Idaho is situated in <u>Caldwell</u>, a city of approximately than 73,000 was recently ranked 51st in the <u>national</u> top 100 for population growth. Caldwell, a city in and the county seat of Canyon County, is located in Idaho's vibrant Snake River <u>wine country</u>. The location provides members of the community easy access to world-class whitewater rafting, fishing, skiing, snowboarding, camping, and miles of trails for hiking, biking, and wildlife viewing. Lake Lowell and the <u>Deer Flat National Wildlife Refuge</u> are less than a 10-minute drive from campus.

The College is 30 minutes from the state capital of Boise, a metropolitan city featuring a rich cultural and political life, including numerous arts and entertainment organizations, shops, museums, restaurants, and sporting events. Julia Davis Park is at the cultural and historic heart of the city and is the home of Zoo Boise and many of the city's museums. The 580-acre campus of the World Center for Birds of Prey, a breeding facility for endangered birds of prey, also sits atop a scenic hill overlooking the city.

The <u>Idaho Shakespeare Festival</u> is a treat each summer. The festival features classic and contemporary comedies and dramas, even musicals, in a completely outdoor amphitheater.
