

The College of Idaho invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in the Business & Accounting Department to start in Fall 2026. We seek candidates whose teaching, research, and service will contribute to our commitment to an equitable and inclusive learning and work environment.

The College currently offers undergraduate majors in accounting, business administration, digital marketing, and finance. We seek an accounting generalist with experience in teaching and research/scholarship who can fill some of the following teaching areas, listed in order of departmental need: Data Analytics, Accounting Information Systems, Advanced Accounting, Financial Accounting, and potentially other business or accounting areas. The normal annual teaching load is 3-1-3 distributed between fall and spring semesters and a 1-month January term. Additional duties include academic advising, scholarship, and service to the College and department. The Department's student-centered approach emphasizes the intersection of theory and practice and prepares graduates for productive careers.
