

ACADEMIC ADVISING

JUNE

Academic Advising needs all transcripts, IB scores, ACT/SAT scores, and preregistration questionnaire completed to build your fall schedule.

JULY

Your Fall schedule will be released July 15th. You will receive access to your schedule and who your Academic Advisor will be for your first year.

AUGUST

Meet one-on-one with your advisor prior to the first day of classes and buy your books. Start of Fall Term.

SEPTEMBER

Meet with your advisor if you have any concerns about your schedule and courseload.

OCTOBER

Meet with your Academic Advisor to get ready and approved for Winter & Spring registration.

NOVEMBER

Registration opens for Sophomores & Freshmen. Work with Academic Advisor to solidify your Winter & Spring schedule.

DECEMBER

Final examinations.

JANUARY

Start of J-Term. PEAK Map Planning Workshop and declare Majors and Minors.

FEBRUARY

Start of Spring Term. PEAK Maps are due.

MARCH

Transition out of First-Year Advising and be assigned new Major Advisors.

APRIL

Registration for Fall with Major Advisors.

- What will my fall term schedule look like?
 - Every student will have FYS-101 First Year Seminar and HIS-110/111/112 Western/World Civilization on their schedule. These are graduation requirements and must be taken your first year. You may also see one course for your intended major, and one elective course.

- Will I have to choose 1 Major & 3 Minors?

Besides that, every student will get to choose Majors and Minors from the remaining three PEAKS (Natural Science & Mathematics, Social Sciences & History, and Humanities & Fine Arts).  - First-Year Academic Advising will work with you June-March (although, we are always around to help). In March you will be transitioned to your Major Advisor and continue to work with them until you graduate.
