LOG INTO C OF I PORTAL

Students are emailed login credentials for their C of I Portal once they submit their application.

Students can view their missing items checklist, application status, and financial aid awards on the Application Portal.

SUBMIT SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS

An application is not complete until all required items are submitted.



OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

Counselors can submit transcripts digitally, via post or fax, or email them to admission@collegeofidaho.edu.



ACT/SAT SCORES OR TEST OPTIONAL* ESSAY RESPONSES

Test Scores may be sent from the counselor, from the testing agency, or applicants may download their Student Score Report ensuring their full name and date of birth is included. If a student chooses to apply Test Optional, they will receive additional essay prompts for completion as part of their application process.



A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

This can come from a teacher or counselor. Letters may be submitted through the Common Application, emailed to admission@collegeofidaho.edu, or students may upload them to their Application Portal.

* WHAT IS TEST OPTIONAL?

A student chooses to apply Test Optional by marking on their application whether or not they want to use their test scores in the admission process. Once a student submits their application, they cannot change their decision. When a student applies Test Optional, instead of standardized test scores, The College of Idaho considers the following factors for both admission decisions and academic merit scholarships:

- Recalculated Academic GPA
- Strength of Curriculum
- Responses to three Test Optional Essay Prompts

A student should still submit their standardized test scores for advising purposes.
