



### **Assistant Professor, Health and Human Performance**

The College of Idaho seeks to fill a tenure-track position with a focus on exercise science and human movement as they relate to health and performance in our undergraduate Health and Human Performance department. The department serves undergraduate Exercise Science Majors, Human Performance Minors, and Health Promotion Minors. The department is seeking a specialist in human movement as it relates to applied anatomy and physiology, biomechanics, kinesiology, sport, health, or other related areas to complement the department's strength in physiology, nutrition, and metabolism. Potential courses include Mechanical Analysis of Sport, Motor Learning/Development, Care and Prevention of Injuries, Anatomy and Physiology, and the opportunity to develop courses related to candidate's expertise. Experience teaching cadaver-based human anatomy and physiology is desired, but not necessary. Modest start-up funds are available. Standard teaching load is 21 units, which includes one course in our January term.

Excellent teaching and mentoring of students are the highest priorities of the College. The successful candidate will be an active scholar capable of developing a research program that involves mentoring undergraduate students. This person will also approach academia with a growth mindset and a commitment to collaboration.

Qualifications: Doctoral degree in movement sciences, rehabilitation sciences, biomechanics, physical therapy, athletic training, or any related field with appropriate background. Strength and conditioning certifications, personal training certifications, and/or coaching experience are highly desirable, but not necessary.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College.
