



Assistant Professor and Director of Speech and Debate

The Department of Theatre and Speech Arts at The College of Idaho invites applications for Assistant Professor and Director of Speech and Debate, beginning fall 2018. This is a tenure-track position. The ideal candidate will hold a PhD degree in speech, communication, or a related field, and will have substantial experience in supervising a college debate team.

We seek an enthusiastic colleague who can teach introductory speech courses and debate practicum courses in support of an active and highly successful debate team. Typical course load at the College is 21-24 credits per year, with three courses in each of the fall and spring semesters and one in the intensive winter term. Coaching and preparing students competing in debate and speech events are counted as part of the teaching load.

In addition, this position will:

- Book travel and lodging arrangements for tournaments
- Participate in the recruitment of area high school speech and debate students
- Supervise assistant coaches
- Travel with and supervise students during tournaments

This position will work closely with the Chair of the Theatre and Speech Arts department to draft and execute program budgets as well as to ensure academic excellence in all speech and debate activities.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from The College of Idaho.
