

## **Assistant Professor of Biology**

The College of Idaho invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor in the Biology Department to start in Fall 2023. We seek candidates whose teaching, research, and service will contribute to our <u>commitment</u> to an equitable and inclusive learning and work environment.

The successful candidate will have a background in a biomedically-related field such as Microbiology, Molecular Biology, Cell Biology, or Genetics; a strong commitment to excellence in teaching undergraduate courses in a liberal-arts context; and an interest in developing a research program that includes collaboration with undergraduate students. Primary responsibilities include teaching required core courses and upper-division courses that align with the candidate's expertise. This position specifically requires regular teaching of an upper-division Microbiology course. The normal annual teaching load is 21 credits distributed between Fall and Spring semesters and a 1-month January term. Research startup funds are available. ## **Qualifications**

A completed PhD in Biological Sciences or closely-related discipline is required prior to beginning employment. Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College.

Review of candidates will begin November 1, 2022 and continue until the position is filled.

Applications should include:

- A letter of interest,
- Curriculum Vitae,
- Statement of teaching philosophy that articulates a commitment to excellence in teaching and mentoring in the context of an undergraduate liberal arts educational setting,
- Statement of research interests that briefly outlines your overall research goals along with how these would incorporate undergraduate students,
- A separate statement describing how your commitment to diversity and inclusion are demonstrated in your teaching, scholarship, or service, and
- Undergraduate and Graduate Transcripts (unofficial transcripts are accepted).

## Following initial review of applications, applicants will be asked to provide at least three letters of recommendation and additional materials may be requested.
