This is a hybrid position involving administrative leadership and teaching 2 courses per year (1 in the fall, 1 in the spring).

The successful candidate will oversee the creation of a unified, institution-wide writing program endorsed by the faculty and designed to consolidate the long tradition of writing excellence at the College of Idaho. This effort will build upon our existing FYS to establish a foundation for writing across the curriculum, utilizing a peer-tutor program to grow and develop writing culture on campus. This is a new position created specifically to develop crucial academic skills.

A strong commitment to undergraduate Liberal Arts education and successful teaching and administrative experience are essential. Prior experience with writing centers, peer tutors, and/or first-year seminars is highly valued. The College also values candidates who have experience working with and mentoring students from diverse backgrounds. Thirty percent of our students are first generation attendees, 18 percent are international students representing approximately 90 countries, and 15 percent are Latinx.

A Master's degree in Rhetoric, Communication Studies, English, or other writing-centered discipline is required at the time of appointment. Generous professional development support for research, conference travel, and sabbatical leave is available. Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College of Idaho.
