Safety:

An analysis of incident reports and post-trip debriefs revealed a very safe season. The highest occurrence of incidents were related to vehicle malfunction. All incidents were quickly resolved by student

leaders.

- Recruit incoming freshmen for student leadership (Strategic Plan Obj. 1)
- Increase program capacity (Obj. 1)
- Grow community partnerships (Obj. 1 and 3)

- Increase community awareness of CIOP (Obj. 4)

Potential Challenges

- Limited capacity to run programs due to staffing, equipment, and transportation
- Limited and unreliable vehicles
- Equipment replacement schedule requires upcoming investments
- Inability to meet student demand for programs -- nearly all programs filled and most had significant waitlists

Opportunities

- High student demand and passionate first-year class
- Increasing partnerships in academics and campus organizations
- High level of engagement in first- and second-year students
- Academic program will begin in 2019/20 school year
