## Collaboration between Naresuan University and The College of Idaho (NMUN Japan)

The Faculty of Social Sciences (FSS), Naresuan University (NU) envisions becoming a Vital Social Engine, making Social Impact, and achieving a Sustainable Glocal Society. Our participation at the National Model United Nations (NMUN) Japan-Kobe is a huge step toward this vision, especially in advancing our students' understanding of the United Nations, international relations, diplomacy, and contemporary global issues.
