

Instructor, Religious Studies

The College of Idaho invites applications for an Instructor position in Religious Studies, beginning Fall 2018. Candidates should hold a Ph.D. (or ABD) in Religious Studies and be able to teach a range of introductory and upper-division courses across religious traditions, including Introduction to World Religions, Buddhism, Hinduism, and Islam. Priority will be given to candidates with demonstrated commitment to teaching excellence and the liberal arts mission. The teaching load is 3-1-3.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from The College of Idaho.

Review of applications will begin on April 16. Send a letter of application, curriculum vitae, and three letters of recommendation to: HR@collegeofidaho.edu. Additional information may be requested of qualified candidates during the review process. Applications will be accepted until a suitable candidate is selected.
