Qualifications

A Master's degree in an appropriate area of study or equivalent professional experience is required. Preference will be given to candidates with prior teaching experience who are able to teach in person, but synchronous, remote instruction will be considered.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from The College of Idaho.
