- Oversee supervision and maintenance of climbing wall.
- Develop a schedule of programs and activities for outdoor program and intramural sports.
- Collaborate with faculty, staff, and students to plan, implement, assess and evaluate new and current program
  operations within outdoor program and intramural sports, including potential revenue-generating
  opportunities.
- Develop short and long-term strategic plans for outdoor program and intramural sports consistent with the mission of The College of Idaho and goals of the Student Affairs Division.
- Ensure compliance with appropriate safety and risk management practices, liability policies and procedures, and emergency action plans.
- Manage operational budget.
- Develop and support research and assessment efforts regarding student learning outcomes and student involvement/satisfaction with outdoor program and intramurals sports that are focused on the importance of campus recreation services to student recruitment and retention efforts.
- Collaborate with the Marketing and Communications Department to generate marketing materials and enhance promotional efforts to reach College of Idaho faculty, staff, students, prospective students, alumni, and the local community.
- Teach an outdoor leadership special topics course, serve as the faculty of record for internships and independent studies, and collaborate in the management of the Outdoor Leadership minor.
- Collaborate with the Health and Human Performance, Environmental Studies, and other academic departments to provide activity courses and field experiences.
- Serve on Division or College committees as appropriate.
- Actively participate in relevant professional associations, e.g. AORE and NIRSA.
