SB 1902 A BILL

Amending Code Section 307 to remove \$1.50 from ASCI and add \$1.50 to the jointly funded account for Model UN to ASCI Code.

WHEREAS:

- I. The College of Idaho's Model UN team has a prestigious sixty-year history on campus and has achieved national recognition with multiple awards at National Model United Nations (NMUN) annual conference in New York [where C of I delegates compete against 2,500 other US and international delegates and have been awarded 9 out the last 10 years!].
- II. Model UN is an experiential learning opportunity technically open to all ASCI students but subject to significant entry barriers for many students because of high participation and out-of-pocket costs.
- III. Model UN, as a designated co-curricular program, is supported by a combination of funds from Academic Affairs, ASCI, donor funds, and out-of-pocket costs by delegates.
- IV. There is a growing number of students that have showed interest but are unable to cover the high out-of-pocket costs to participate at NMUN.
- V. The \$1.50 from ASCI would help defray team travel costs that include rising airfare, airport transportation, hotel accommodations, and conference fees.
- VI. That, after raising \$5,000-\$12,000 a year from parents, families, grandparents, faculty, and other donors, requisite to support the C of I's participation at NMUN, all C of I team members are still required to cover their own food expenses for one week as they receive no per diem for their travel (unlike C of I athletes, debaters, and other students who represent the College in competitive events and receive per diem allocations).
- VII. At the current ASCI code allocation there is a lack of funding to provide for more than the normal 8 student delegates without further increasing out-of-pocket costs and barrier-of-entry for participation.

308: ASCI Student Fees

All ASCI Student fees will be set by the ASCI Executive Council and approved by the ASCI Senate by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote. These fees should be reviewed annually each Fall term and shall be set at the amount that both parties deem most fitting for the following year.

307: Jointly Funded Accounts
