

Director of Choral Activities, Visiting Assistant Professor

The College of Idaho seeks a Visiting Assistant Professor of Music to serve as Director of Choral Activities for the 2024-25 school year. We seek candidates who share the College's <u>commitment</u> to creating an equitable and inclusive academic community.

The primary job duties include directing the general College of Idaho Chorale and select Chamber Singers. Additional duties include teaching conducting and music education courses. The successful candidate will create high-quality, cohesive performance programs that are both artistic and educational. The successful candidate will also be expected to engage in outreach with local schools and the community.

A DMA or PhD in choral conducting or music education is required (ABD considered). Preference will be given to candidates with college- or secondary-level teaching and conducting experience, a background as a vocalist and vocal instructor, the ability to work collaboratively, and a passion for liberal arts education.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College.
