

## Visiting Assistant Professor, Developmental or Educational Psychology

The Department of Psychology invites applications for a 1-year visiting assistant professor position in **DEVELOPMENTAL or EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY**, beginning August 2020. Preference will be given to candidates with a PhD in psychology or a related field at the time of appointment. Excellent teaching and mentoring of students are the highest priorities of the College. Experience with the liberal arts is highly desired.

Primary responsibilities include teaching courses in the candidate's area of specialization (developmental and educational psychology courses) as well as other courses required for the major, such as General Psychology and Introduction to Psychological Science. Standard annual teaching load is 21 credits (3:1:3), which includes one course in our intensive January term. The shape of the psychology major follows the APA guidelines for the undergraduate psychology major, including basic courses in four specific domains: biological, developmental, cognitive, and social. The successful candidate will be an active scholar interested in conducting research in collaboration with undergraduate students. Modest funds are available for research supplies and faculty conference travel.

Review of applications will begin **MARCH 25** and continue until the position is filled. Applications should include a cover letter, CV, statement of teaching philosophy that clearly articulates a commitment to liberal arts education, evidence of teaching effectiveness, statement of research interests, and 3 letters of recommendation. At least one letter must address teaching.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from the College.
