



Visiting Assistant Professor of Spanish

The College of Idaho invites applications for a Visiting Assistant Professor of Spanish (specialty: Linguistics or Literary Studies) beginning August 2018, housed in the Department of World Languages, Literatures, and Cultures. The ideal candidate will be able to offer a wide range of courses, from Spanish language and culture to advanced special topics.

Candidates should demonstrate interest in working with our diverse student population, including heritage and native speakers. Excellent teaching and mentoring of students are the highest priorities of the College. The usual teaching load is 21 credits per year, which includes a course in the College's intensive January term. Ph.D. and native or near-native proficiency in Spanish and English are required.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from The College of Idaho.
