Visiting Assistant Professor, Voice

The College of Idaho invites applications for a full-time position as Visiting Assistant Professor of Voice, beginning Fall 2018. This is a one-year replacement position with the possibility for renewal. The primary responsibilities are teaching applied voice and related course work. The position also includes oversight of an opera or musical production. The successful candidate will demonstrate a strong commitment to teaching in a liberal arts environment.

Qualifications: A soprano or mezzo-soprano with a DM or DMA, teaching, performance, and directing experience is preferred; ABD candidates and other voice types will be considered.

Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States as of the expected hire date and throughout the date of the contract without sponsorship from The College of Idaho.

Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Candidates should apply by June 22 for full consideration. Qualified candidates are invited to submit a letter of application describing interest and experience, curriculum vitae, 2 letters of recommendation, a statement of teaching philosophy, links to a recording of a performance within the last 12 months, and, if available, a 15-minute excerpt of the candidate teaching a voice lesson.
