(YOTEFAM SOCIAL COMPACT)

The YotePact is our collective commitment to keeping The College of Idaho and local communities as healthy and safe as possible. It is our institutional and individual responsibility to adhere to certain empirically-supported measures that limit the spread of COVID-19. We are a YoteFam and we pledge to keep one another safe by adhering to the following components of the YotePact:

PROTECT MYSELF AND OTHERS

- Get vaccinated, if able!
- If not vaccinated, wear a mask, maintain physical distance (3-6 feet) from others whenever possible.
- Wash hands often with soap and water, and use hand sanitizer when it is available.
- Disinfect living, dining, learning, and work spaces regularly.
- Monitor daily for COVID-19 symptoms (headache, sore throat, cough, fever, shortness of breath, loss of taste/smell).
- Self-quarantine when exhibiting symptoms, or when exposed to someone who is COVID-19 positive (unless vaccinated or within 90 days after testing positive), and complete an online [COVID-19 Self-Reporting Form](#).
- Candidly comply with contact tracing efforts.
- Maintain empathy and compassion for your fellow Yotes.

PROTECT OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY

- Refrain from planning any events or activities that do not adhere to current College, State of Idaho, and CDC COVID-19 safety guidelines.
- Be an upstander, and address situations where peers and colleagues are not adhering to COVID-19 mitigation practices.
- Limit travel off-campus.
- Respect personal space, and attempt to maintain physical distancing guidelines.
- Practice good hygiene.

The College expects all members of our community to adhere to this pledge both on and off-campus. Students who don't adhere to this pledge will have violated the Code of Conduct and may be subject to judicial sanction, and/or administrative restriction from campus. Employees who violate this pledge will be subject to corrective action, and continued violations will result in disciplinary actions up to and including termination.
